ORDINANCE NO. 21-_____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 52 SECTION 4 OF THE CITY OF ROGERS CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Rogers City Council, upon recommendation of its Transportation Committee, finds it to be in the best interest of the City to update the provisions governing temporary street and parking lot closures found in Section 52-4 of its Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, these changes will ease the time restrictions on applicants requesting temporary closures and give the Transportation Committee the ability to consider special circumstances and emergencies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: Chapter 52, Article I, Section 52-4, Subsection (b), of the City of Rogers, Code of Ordinances is amended to read as shown in the attached Exhibit “A” and Municode Corporation is hereby instructed to make said amendments;

Section 2: Chapter 52, Article I, Section 52-4, Subsection (c), of the City of Rogers, Code of Ordinances is amended to read as shown in the attached Exhibit “A” and Municode Corporation is hereby instructed to make said amendments;

Section 3: Subsection (d) shall be added to Chapter 52, Article I, Section 52-4, of the City of Rogers, Code of Ordinances is amended to read as shown in the attached Exhibit “A” and Municode Corporation is hereby instructed to make said amendments;

Section 4: Emergency Clause: The need to amend said City Code chapter is immediate in order to protect the public peace, health, safety, and welfare. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of passage and approval;

Section 5: Severability Provision: If any part of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in effect as if such invalid portion never existed; and

Section 6: Repeal of Conflicting Provisions: All Ordinances, Resolutions, or Orders of the City Council, or parts of the same, in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

EXHIBIT "A"

Sec. 52-4. - Emergency and experimental regulations.

- (a) For the purposes of addressing emergencies or special conditions, and/or during special events, the transportation committee of the Rogers City Council may approve, create, and enforce temporary closures or experimental regulations, as they may relate to city streets and city owned parking lots.
- (b) Any requests for street or parking lot closures under this section must be presented to the transportation committee of the Rogers City Council, in writing, and at least ~~45~~ 30 days prior to the closure date requested. Prior to presenting the request for closure to the transportation committee, the requestor must have approval, in writing, from the Rogers Chief of Police indicating that the closure will not create a public safety hazard. Notice of the requested closure shall be provided to all property owners and/or occupants adjoining the part of the street or parking lot that is subject to closure under the request. This notice shall be in writing and shall state the date and time of the requested closure, the location of the closure, and the date and time of the transportation committee hearing during which the closure will be considered. Requestors must provide such written notice to adjoining property owners and/or occupants at least 15 days prior to the date and time of the transportation committee meeting at which the closure will be considered. Such written notice may be hand delivered or mailed to the property owners and/or occupants via U.S. Postal Service.
- ~~(c) All street closures for construction work are exempted from the requirements contained in subsection (b) above. Street closure requests for construction work must be submitted for approval to the City of Rogers Planning Department by 5:00 p.m. five business days prior to the proposed start of work and must be accompanied by a copy of written plans for the construction project. The City of Rogers Planning Department may administratively approve the construction closure or may forward it to the next available transportation committee meeting for consideration. Parades and motorcades as defined by, and provided for, in sections 52-230 through 52-240 of this Code shall be governed by the requirements of those Code sections and are exempt from the requirements and provisions contained in subsections (a) and (b) above. The transportation committee may hear a closure request presented later than 30 days prior to the closure date, if exigent circumstances are shown and with a majority vote of the transportation committee members. A request made under this provision must be in compliance with all other requirements of this section.~~
- (d) All street closures for construction work are exempted from the requirements contained in subsection (b) ~~or (c)~~ above. Street closure requests for construction work must be submitted for approval to the City of Rogers Planning Department by 5:00 p.m. five business days prior to the proposed start of work and must be accompanied by a copy of written plans for the construction project. The City of Rogers Planning Department may administratively approve the construction closure or may forward it to the next available transportation committee meeting for consideration. Parades and motorcades as defined by, and provided for, in sections 52-230 through 52-240 of this Code shall be governed by the requirements of those Code sections and are exempt from the requirements and provisions contained in subsections (a), ~~and (b), and (c)~~ above.

WHEREAS, the language in the Rogers City Code providing for the adoption of the Arkansas Fire Prevention Code needs to be amended to improve safety for citizens in the city; and

WHEREAS, it is beneficial to the citizens of the City of Rogers that the Rogers City Code is amended to provide protection from the threat of fire in all multi-family structures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: Chapter 20, Article III, Division 2, Section 20-141 of the City of Rogers, Code of Ordinances is amended to read as shown in the attached Exhibit "A" and Municode Corporation is hereby instructed to make said amendments;

Section 2: Emergency Clause: The need to amend said City Code chapter is immediate in order to protect the public peace, health, safety, and welfare. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of passage and approval;

Section 3: Severability Provision: If any part of this Resolution is held invalid, the remainder of this Resolution shall continue in effect as if such invalid portion never existed; and

Section 4: Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions: All Ordinances, Resolutions, or Orders of the City Council, or parts of the same, in conflict with this Resolution are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Sec. 20-141 – Adopted

There is hereby adopted by reference, as fully as though set out herein verbatim, that certain published code known as the International Fire Code, 2012 Edition, complete with appendices B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, and J, including any accumulative supplements and amendments as and when adopted and approved by the State of Arkansas, three copies of which are on file in the office of the Rogers Clerk-Treasurer. The above referenced International Fire Code 2012 Edition, and all of its supplements and amendments, is hereby adopted as the 2013 Arkansas Fire Prevention Code for regulating and governing the safeguarding of life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storing, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices, and conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises in the City of Rogers; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, conditions and terms of such International Fire Code, 2012 edition, published by the International Code Council, on file in the office of the clerk-treasurer are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in this division. Furthermore, the 2012 International Residential Code, Section R313 is adopted for the purposes of requiring automatic fire sprinkler systems in all residential dwellings meeting the classification of townhouses and duplexes.

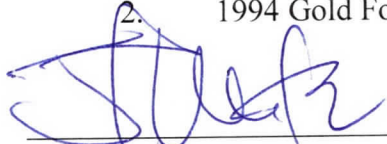

ORDINANCE NO. 21-_____

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ROGERS CODE SECTION 14-675 BY RE-ZONING
CERTAIN LANDS FROM N-R TO NBT, PROVIDING FOR
THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Rogers Code Section Rogers Code Section 14-725, et seq, and upon the consideration of the report and recommendations of the Planning Commission of the City of Rogers, Benton County, Arkansas, on August 3, 2021, the City Council has found that certain lands hereinafter described are better suited for NBT zoning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1: That Section 14-675 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Rogers, should be and the same hereby is amended as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2: That the land hereinafter described should be and the same is hereby zoned as NBT and that said lands being in Benton County, Arkansas, are described as:

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

Lot 3, Block 7, J. Wade Sike's Subdivision, City of Rogers, Benton County, Arkansas as shown in Plat Book "B" at Page 20.

LAYMAN'S DESCRIPTION:

623 S. 3rd Street

SECTION 3: Zoning. That the above described lands are better suited for NBT than N-R zoning and same should be and are hereby zoned NBT.

SECTION 4: Emergency Clause. That it is necessary to bring proposed uses of the property into conformance with the Rogers City Zoning Ordinances and because of such an emergency is declared to exist and in order to protect the public peace, health, safety and welfare, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of its passage and approval.

SECTION 5: Severability Provision. In the event that any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, or other provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision, other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional, and the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be construed as if such invalid, unenforceable or unconstitutional provision or provisions had never been contained herein.

SECTION 6: Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances and Resolutions. All ordinances, resolutions or orders of the City Council, or parts of ordinances, resolutions or orders of the City Council in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
